Big Idea: God's plan of redemption provides me hope in every situation

Biblical Living Hope: a confident expectation for the future anchored in the character of God, promises of God and the power of God

My Hope Comes Through (Ruth 1-4):

1) Recognizing My True Redeemer (Ruth 1-3)

2) Relying On My True Redeemer (Ruth 3-4)

"When the time came to completion, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!'" – Galatians 4:4-6

2 Ways To Rely On My True Redeemer:

- 1) Trust God's Sovereignty In My Broken Reality
- 2) Turn To My Redeemer For Liberation From My Devastation
